Ohio 4-H Records Retention

Like OSU, Ohio 4-H collects a great deal of information and data about those involved in the youth program. The professionals giving leadership to the 4-H Youth Development program therefore want to manage that information in such a way that it complies with university policy, state and federal laws; maintains the information needed to manage the program daily; and preserves information of historical value to either the 4-H Extension program or the community.

This document identifies records managed by the 4-H Youth Development program and provides a retention record that is aligned as closely as possible with the record management of the university.

Changes in Ohio State Fair Companion Animal Day Judging for 2014

Companion Animal Day at the Ohio State Fair will follow similar guidelines to other non-livestock state fair entries. Instead of 4-H members entering one or more companion animal projects by a given deadline and paying an entry fee, counties can enter and send their companion animal project winners the same way as other non-livestock projects. For example, the first place junior and senior winner in each of the following companion animal projects will be eligible to bring their animal to the OSF Companion Animal Day Judging: Cat 1 – Purrr-fect Pals, Project No. 216; Cat 2 – Climbing Up, Project No. 217; Cat 3 – Leaping Forward, Project No. 218; Cavies (Guinea Pigs), Project No. 215; Pet Rabbits, Project No. 227; Pocket Pets, Project No. 220; Reptiles & Amphibians, Idea Starter No. 365.13; 4-H PetPALS, Project No. 230, and Self-Determined, Project No. 365 (which could include pets like hedgehogs, chinchillas, ferrets, birds, etc.).

Therefore, if counties want to send 4-H members taking these companion animal projects to the Ohio State Fair, they will need to be selected at the county level prior to them exhibiting at the State Fair. Companion Animal Day Judging will be Friday, July 25, 2014.

Nancy Harriett (Hudson) Bull, Ph.D. recently was selected for a prestigious honor - as an inductee into the National 4-H Hall of Fame. Nancy worked in the Greene County Extension office from 1975-1990 as the County Extension Agent, Home Economics. Nancy was also Assistant Leader for Small Business and Associate Professor with OSU Extension from 1990-1992.

After leaving OSU Extension in Greene County, Nancy served as the Associate Director for Extension at the University of Connecticut. Nancy now is Vice – Provost and Chief Information Officer for the University of Connecticut.

The National 4-H Hall of Fame was established in 2002. It is a partnership with the 4-H Centennial Project, National Association of Extension 4-H Agents, and the National 4-H Council, 4-H Youth Development Program, and the United States Department of Agriculture. States are encouraged to nominate individuals based on their outstanding leadership at the local, state, national, and international levels.

Nancy will be inducted into the National 4-H Hall of Fame on October 11, 2013 at the National 4-H Center in Chevy Chase, Maryland. This year's inductees include only 16 individuals from across the country representing Extension land grant organizations.

Nancy's hard work in the Greene County community continues to impact the work of OSU Extension, Greene County. Greene County was lucky to have such a dynamic leader at the Extension Office for many years.
