Master's in Plant Health Management Degree Offered

In Spring 2014 semester several courses, which are part of the Master's in Plant Health Management degree program, will be offered on the campus in Columbus, Wooster, as well as through CarmenConnect.

Principles and Applications of Integrated Pest Management (ENTMLGY 5600, 3 cr; <http://entomology.osu.edu/graduate/courses>) on TuThTuTh 11:10AM - 12:30PM Kottman Hall 0245 (LEC). The course covers key insect pest of field crops, greenhouses and others, Integrated Pest Management, including how it addresses environmental compatibility, production efficiency, economic viability, and social responsibility. Diseases of Field Crops (PLNTPH 5140, 3 cr) is taught on Thursdays, 5:30 - 7:20 pm by Anne Dorrance (dorrance.1@osu.edu) and Pierce Paul (paul.661@osu.edu). The course covers the key diseases of field crops, including identification, management and evaluation of management strategies.
