Lunch will be provided. Both sessions will be similar in focus and content.

The 4-H CARTEENS Design Team is offering this opportunity. The primary purposes are to: [1] Share 4-H CARTEEN programming ideas and materials; and [2] Explain the details of the implementation of the 4-H CARTEENS applied research initiative.

Whether you are currently conducting a 4-H CARTEENS program, or would like to investigate this opportunity, each of these sessions will provide programming materials and ideas to enhance your efforts. Such face-to-face gatherings on a specific topic always provide great networking opportunities.

In the fall of 2013 the 4-H CARTEENS Design Team received Ohio State University Institutional Review Board (IRB) approval for data collection from 4-H CARTEENS participants to determine the impact of this programming. At the March 19th and April 3rd meetings, this data collection instrument will be shared, and its use explained. Whether your county signed-on in as one of the fourteen counties to officially participate in this research or not, EVERYONE WITH 4-H CARTEENS PROGRAMS IS EXPECTED TO USE THIS INSTRUMENT. At the minimum, it will provide impact data to share with local partners.

But the 4-H CARTEENS programming impact can be shown on a larger and more powerful scale by participating in the 4-H CARTEENS research. How to participate will be explained at these meetings? If there are counties who did not sign-on originally to be a part of this project, we will explain how they can now become involved.
