Thanks to the generosity of the Ohio Harness Horsemen's Association, an event was held in August 2014 that netted \$5,000 for Ohio 4-H. These monies will be awarded to five counties in mini-grants of \$1,000 upon completion & submission of the application form (archer.3@osu.edu) by November 4, 2014, and the subsequent selection. The purpose of this mini-grant program is to provide the opportunity for county 4-H Horse Programs to initiate new/ innovative horse related educational programming that will benefit their county's 4-H Horse project members and/ or volunteers, as well as the potential to share the programming idea with other counties throughout Ohio. All projects should be completed by June 30, 2015.

Special Note of Recognition

Colleague Bill Harris, County Extension Educator, 4-H Youth Development, officially retires at the end of August.

Bill was hired by OSU Extension as the 4-H Agent in Trumbull County in 1979. Several years later in 1982 as Summit County Agent he developed a stress management school program called *Beat the Rat Race*. As an excellent photographer he taught his craft in the county, at state 4-H in services, and Teen and Volunteer Conferences. He has served on the volunteer specialist team/committee and has always been at the "head of the line" in his philosophy on what 4-H professionals should do and what was appropriate for volunteers to handle.

In July 1988 he began serving in Stark County as the 4-H Agent and Co-Chair in Stark and Summit Counties. In 1995 Bill became District Specialist, 4-H in the Northeast District where he was a leaderin in developing early middle manager materials for 4-H and Extension. For many years he managed communication days at the Ohio State Fair, always pushing the event towards contemporary technology.

In November 2009 Bill move to Medina County as 4-H Extension Educator and in 2013 became interim CED. While serving in urban counties, Bill believed that it was most appropriate for 4-H to be in the classroom. We wish Bill good fortune and good health in his retirement.

Ohio's Centennial video contest winners also recently received second place at the National 4-H Film Festival in the category of "Voices of 4-H History." As part of the Ohio video contest – which asked folks to show/tell what Extension means to them, Extension supported a trip for the state winners to the National 4-H Film Festival this summer.

Eric Glaze and *Ben Sanders* of the Pathfinders 4-H Club in *Warren County* submitted their film "A *Centennial of Extension with Dr. D. Howard Doster*" as part of the national festival which was held in early August in St. Louis. Eric and Ben received a certificate and GoPro camera for their efforts.

Now in its fourth year, the national festival involved 60 4-H members from nine states, and 32 films were selected for screening. Youth participated in sessions with a casting director, sound and lighting production and stuntman.
