PLEASE NOTE FOR COMPANION ANIMAL DAY JUDGING

- Youth **ARE NOT** permitted to bring live animals to judging. Please refer to the judging criteria below.
- All projects, INCLUDING *All About Dogs and You and Your Dog* will be judged on Friday, July 31 at the Lausche Youth Exploration Center.
- The Ohio 4-H PetPALS program will offer all participants the opportunity to be interviewed at the Ohio State Fair Dog Show on **Wednesday, July 21**. Participants who have met all project requirements will receive an award for their dedication to the program. Participants in this program with dog project animals will continue as usual with judging at the Ohio State Fair Dog Show. Participants with other species will be allowed to come to the Ohio State Fair Dog Show **WITHOUT** their animal to participate in an interview. All participants will need to enter the PetPALS class through the Ohio State Fair livestock entry platform under Ohio State Fair, Get Involved, Livestock Competitions, Dog Show. GENERAL GUIDELINES

1. Participation is open to youth ages 8 and in the third grade, or 9 years old and older regardless of grade level, as of January 1, 2026. The last year of eligibility, or participation, in 4-H is the year in which the individual turns 19.
2. The clock trophy winner of any one class in 2025 will **not** be eligible to participate in the same class for 2026 with the following exceptions: if the winners of the 2025 Pocket Pet classes (J-10 and J-11), the Reptiles and Amphibians class (J-14), and the Self-Determined class (J-15) are taking DIFFERENT species within those projects from the species with which they won in 2025.

(for youth taking any companion animal project not listed above, such as caged birds, pot-bellied pigs, hermit crabs, pet chickens, etc...)

- *Pocket Pets*, Project No. 220, **includes only the following animals:** mice, rats, hamsters, and gerbils.
- *Self-Determined Companion Animals* should be judged during Companion Animal Day. Youth may NOT have their self-determined companion animal projects judged at both Companion Animal Day and Self-Determined Day.
- *All About Dogs* is for beginning level members who are not ready to take a 4-H dog project that requires owning a dog.
- *You and Your Dog* classes are interview classes for youth WITHOUT their dogs. Youth showing dogs at the Ohio State Fair Dog Shows are not eligible to participate in these interview classes. Youth being interviewed in *You and Your Dog* classes are not eligible to enter any dog in the Ohio State Fair Dog Shows. **Please note: Age ranges of state fair delegate youth relating to dog classes at companion animal day judging are consistent with other age brackets of state fair companion animal day judging and not with the Ohio State Fair dog show.**

4. Each county may send no more than **ONE** participant in each class.

5. No one individual may participate in more than one class.

JUDGING CRITERIA

1. Participants will have an interview with a judge.
2. There will be a 7-minute time limit for each interview.
3. The judge will evaluate participants on their knowledge of the project, the overall interview, and the visual display. Refer to OSF Companion Animal Day score sheets, which can be found at the end of these rules. Study questions are available for All About Dogs and You and Your Dog projects. These questions are posted at: go.osu.edu/CAresources
4. Participants must bring:
 - a. Completed project book (if applicable); completed project records.
 - b. An educational display representing the learning experience of the 2025 current project. This display may be in addition to, or updated from, what was used either at local 4-H judging or county fair judging. Your display should include visuals of you interacting with your pet such as handling, feeding, grooming, cleaning habitat, etc. Examples of displays: poster, scrapbook, computer-generated slides, video, etc... You may use a computer for exhibit presentation, however there is no internet connection available, so make sure your presentation is downloaded to the computer.
