teachings. The timing and how the student receives feedback is considered in order to encourage learners to engage in
discussion.

 - Use of case studies to generate creative thinking and problem solving when serving as a camp counselor.
 - Incorporate emotions in examples to encourage individuals to remember material.
 - Allow for creativity when developing responses.
 - Design diagrams and graphics so that text labels are integrated, rather than putting text off to the side or underneath.
 - Utilize online discussions built around experiences from students' own lives.
 - Allow for early and frequent opportunities for success.
 - Have frequent, small- stakes assessments.
 - Provide rapid feedback, e.g., via auto- grading.
