EVENT GUIDELINES

- 1. Age of Participants:
 - Junior age 13 and under
 - Senior 14 and older
 - Participants in shooting sports classes (J-1 thru J-17) must have been at least 9 years old as of January 1 of the current year according to Ohio 4-H Shooting Sports policy.
 - Classes J-18 (Safe Use of Guns) and J-19 (Basic Archery) Ages 8-18
- 2. Participation Guidelines:
 - Winner of any class in 2019 is not eligible to participate in the same class for 2020.
 - No more than one participant per county in any one class is allowed.
 - No one individual may participate in more than one interview class.
 - A certified shooting sports instructor must sign the cover of the member record book to be eligible to compete in 4-H Shooting Sports (Projects 750, 751, 752, 753, 754, 755, 756 and 757).
 - Guns, bows, arrows, ammunition, and firearms of any kind are not permitted on the Fairgrounds. Participants may not use any of these items or three-dimensional replicas of these items as a part of any display. Displays also may not include any part of an arrow longer than 6 inches. Displays may not include any 'loaded' ammunition. Any shells or casings must be open so that a visual examination can show that there is no powder in ammunition (the caps must be either absent or expended). Wild bird feathers, except legal game species, and all bird nests and eggs are protected under state and federal laws and are not permitted to be collected, possessed, or presented as a part of any display.
- 3. Type of Evaluation:
 - Participants have a personal interview evaluation with a judge.
 - The judge evaluates each participant on the following basis (also see sample score sheet):
 - 30% Knowledge (Basic concepts learned in the project)
 - 20% Communication (Presentation of the project)
 - 20% Project book
 - 20% Project Display (Quality)
 - 10% Leadership/Citizenship
- 4. Participant to bring:
 - Registration information provided by county 4-H educator.
 - Completed project book. A certified Shooting Sports Instructor must sign the cover of the member record book to be eligible to compete in 4-H Shooting Sports (Projects 750, 751, 752, 753, 754, 755, 756 and 757).
 - A display representing the learning experience of the current project. The display should be one used either at local 4-H judging or at county fair. Because of space limitations, each participant removes his or her display from the judging area when the interview is complete.
- 5. When you arrive:
 - On the day of the event, please report to registration in the Youth Center no more than 15 minutes before your county's scheduled time. You will be directed to the judging area. When you have completed your interview, you are free to enjoy the fair until 4:30 p.m., when awards will be presented on the center stage. If you cannot be present for the awards presentation, you may want to arrange for an adult to pick up your award should you receive one. Unclaimed awards are eventually sent to county Extension offices, usually in the fall.
