GENERAL GUIDELINES

1. Age of Participants:
2. 4-H Age -
Junior Division – 13 years of age and younger
Senior Division – 14 years of age and older
3. Participation Guidelines:
 - Each county may have no more than one participant in each class. No exhibitor shall be entered in more than one class.
 - Winner of any class in 2023 is not eligible to participate in the same class for 2024.
 - All participants must be enrolled in 4-H Project #499-*You Can Quilt*, #498-*Quilting the Best Better* or #365-*Self-Determined*.
 - Participants will register at the time indicated for their county.
4. Type of Evaluation:
 - Participants will participate in an interview evaluation with a judge. Participants will be judged based on their knowledge, skill, and understanding related to the quilting project (40%), the quality of their finished mini quilt (40%), the quality of their project records in documenting project accomplishments (10%), and their interview performance (10%).
5. Participant should bring with them to registration:
 - Registration information provided by County 4-H Youth Development Educator.
 - Completed project book and other project records documenting what they did in their 4-H quilt project.
 - Refer to additional project requirements as listed in class list below.

CLASSES

Note – all mini quilts must be stitched or knotted by the 4-H member. **Quilts machine quilted by someone other than the 4-H member will be automatically judged in the Self-Determined Quilting category.**

- J-21 **You Can Quilt, Junior**
Participants should bring **ONE MINI QUILT** (as per pattern(s) provided in the project book).
- J-22 **You Can Quilt, Senior**
Participants should bring **ONE MINI QUILT** (as per pattern(s) provided in the project book).
- J-23 **Quilting the Best Better**
Participants should bring one lap quilt (as per pattern(s) provided in the project book.)
- J-24 **Self-Determined Quilting--Junior**
Participants in this class are encouraged to bring their Self-Determined project manual (4-H 365) showing involvement in and progress made toward completing their self-determined project along with the quilt or quilted items designed and constructed for their project.
- J-25 **Self-Determined Quilting--Senior**
Participants in this class are encouraged to bring their Self-Determined project manual (4-H 365) showing involvement in and progress made toward completing their Self-Determined project along with the quilt or quilted items designed and constructed for their project.

AWARDS

1. All participants will receive a participation ribbon sponsored by The Ohio State Fair.
2. "Outstanding of the Day" ribbons, sponsored by **The Ohio State Fair**, will be awarded to the top 20% of the class.
3. A clock trophy will be awarded to the class winner. In 2023 the trophies were sponsored by **The Central Ohio Modern Quilt Guild**
4. Awards will be presented at 6:30 pm.
