

Ohio State Fair Junior Horse Show 2021

ENTRY DEADLINE: July 7, 2021 by 1:00pm; entries must be made online at <https://ohorse.fairwire.com> with payment of \$50 stall fee. Late entries will be accepted until 1:00pm on July 8, 2021. Late entries must be made to Ohio State Fair Entry Department at 614-644-4052; a \$100 Late Entry Fee must accompany the entry and \$50 stall fee, or it will not be processed.

ADMISSION: There is no cost for admission; however, you will be charged to park.

TACK STALLS: Designated community tacks stalls will be available in each aisle. In addition, a limited number of tack stalls will be available for purchase at \$50 stall on a first come, first serve basis. Stall request forms can be found at <http://horse.osu.edu> on the Junior Horse Show event page. The deadline for tack stall requests is July 7, 2021 at 1:00pm.

GROUP STALLS: Exhibitors wishing to stall together must submit an online Stall Request form by the entry deadline of Wednesday, July 7, 2021 at 1:00pm. A copy of each exhibitor's stall receipt must be uploaded with the entry form at the time of submission for the exhibitor to be included in the request. SKILLATHON – Thursday, July 22, 10:00 a.m. – 3:00 p.m. for all youth. The Horse Skillathon will be held in the mezzanine of the Voinovich building.

VEHICLE TRAVEL DIRECTIONS – Exhibitors traveling south on I-71 will exit Hudson Street (exit 112) go across Hudson Street onto Silver Drive. At the first traffic light on Silver Drive, turn right and follow the signs to Gate 10 for entrance to the fairgrounds. Exhibitors traveling north on I-71 will exit Hudson Street (exit 112) and turn left onto Hudson Street and go to the first traffic light, which is Silver Drive, turn left onto Silver Drive, then turn right at the first light, follow the signs to Gate 10 for entrance to the fairgrounds. Follow traffic control directions to the horse barn, on arrival, please report to the Junior Horse Show Stall Office for stall assignments.

PARKING – Exhibitors will need to purchase a parking pass before entering the fairgrounds to unload or load their animals. Exhibitors may purchase a daily parking pass for \$10 or a Junior Horse Show parking pass for \$50 (good for 6 days). Only cars and pickups are allowed to park on top of the Gilligan Complex, no campers or propane. If the parking lot is full, you will be required to park in general parking.

LIVESTOCK TRAILER PARKING AREA — You are required to park your livestock trailer in the north lot. Once you unload please follow traffic control direction to the livestock trailer parking area.

EXITING THE GROUNDS WITH ANIMALS – Each and every vehicle transporting livestock from the fairgrounds must have a signed release slip from your department director to present to the gate attendant in order to exit. This will be enforced.

OHIO FIRE CODES: All exhibitors should review and can find Ohio Fire Codes at www.ohiostatefair.com

All youth age 19 and under, participating in any 4-H equestrian activity, are required to wear properly fitted protective headgear which meets or exceeds current ASTM (American Society for Testing Materials) SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards with the chin harness securely fastened at all times while riding or driving an equine.

It is the responsibility of the rider, or the parent or the guardian of the youth participant, to make sure that the headgear worn complies with appropriate safety standards for protective headgear intended for equestrian use, and is properly fitted and in good condition. The Ohio 4-H Horse Program, show committees, officials, Extension personnel, and volunteer leaders are not responsible for checking headgear worn for such compliance.

The Ohio 4-H Horse Program, show committees, officials, extension personnel, and volunteer leaders make no representation or warranty, expressed or implied, about any protective headgear, and cautions riders that death or serious injury may result despite wearing such headgear, as no helmet can protect against all foreseeable injuries in equestrian activities.

The Ohio 4-H Horse Program, show committees, officials, extension personnel, and volunteer leaders may, at his/her discretion, check a participant's protective headgear for proper standards. If the youth is found to be wearing unapproved, defective, or improperly fitted headgear, he/she is not permitted to participate in riding or driving activities until proper headgear is acquired.
