

Safety

In order to ensure the safety of all involved, 4-H members taking a companion animal to judging must ensure that their animal is ok to be around other animals and strangers. These factors are considered when determining the safety of an animal at judging:

- Health of the animal
 - All animals being exhibited at judging should be in good health
 - Cats & Ferrets are required to have health forms filled out by a Veterinarian to ensure proper vaccinations have been given
- Temperament of the animal
 - o It is important that the animal be calm and well behaved, if an animal is overly stressed they may act aggressively
 - o The animal should be comfortable in the judging environment

The judging process for companion animal projects is not the same as the process for other "still" projects, while there are some similarities, there are also many differences.

 - o Before hand & at judging
- Practice showmanship
- Take your animal to new environments
- Introduce your animal to new people
