Feed Mill Workers process grain deliveries, mix feed rations and transport feed to farms.



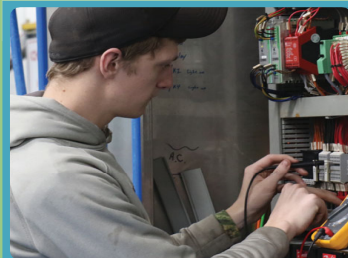
It's Important to Maintain Modern Farming Equipment to Ensure Operations Run Smoothly

Mechanics, Maintenance and Construction Workers ensure barns are in good condition and make necessary repairs through welding, electrical and plumbing work.

Equipment Operators control machinery like forklifts, skid steers, tractors and dump trucks to assist with construction projects and other daily tasks.

Tech Support ensures devices like air controls and computers are functioning properly and enjoys learning about new technologies.
