For Breeding and Market

When breeding rabbits, accurate and consistent record keeping is essential to success. Doe and buck cage record cards for each rabbit must be kept up to date. Information on a doe's breeding record tells you if she has conceived on a regular basis during the year, if she is prolific, and has the ability to properly nurse and care for her litters. An accurate buck breeding record is important to know if he has settled all of his does during the year. Also, this card is for recording information on the growth performance of his offspring.

Complete the doe and buck breeding records below for your project breeding doe and/or buck. If you have more than one doe or buck, copy the records and complete one for each breeding animal. Copies of these pages are also available at **go.osu.edu/4hrabbitresources**. Attach these to this record section of your project book. If you use cage cards that are similar to these records or records from a computer program, attach them for all project animals.

Breeding Chore Sheets

Keep track of your daily chores in your rabbitry by completing a chore sheet. A list of what you must do each day can be kept on a card, sheet of paper, computer printout, or even a calendar. Keep chore sheets so you know what does are to be bred, what does need to be palpated, when nest boxes must be put in certain cages, when you should weigh litters, wean litters, check does for new litters, and so forth. The chore sheets help prevent you from making costly mistakes.
