





## Miscellaneous Expenses

For Breeding, Market, and Pet

Record any miscellaneous expenses for your project animal(s) other than feed expenses. Miscellaneous expenses include feed equipment, rabbits purchased, veterinary supplies, registration fees, electricity, water, building repairs, show supplies, transportation, marketing expenses, etc. Use this information to complete the Summary of Income and Expenses. If you need more copies of this page, it is available at **go.osu.edu/rabbitresources**.

If you buy an item that will be used by a group of project and non-project animals, divide the total cost by the total number of animals. Then multiply that answer by the number of project animals to determine Total Expense for your project. For example, if you have nine rabbits and only three of them are project animals, divide the cost of your bedding by 9 and then multiply by 3. Record that number in parentheses, as shown in the bedding example in the table below.

 $$23.98 \div 9 \text{ total animals} = $2.66$ 

 $$2.66 \times 3$  project animals = \$7.98

In other words, only \$7.98 of that purchase went toward your project animals.
