

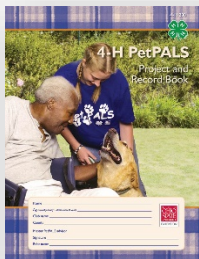
Using the Leader's Guide

- *Preparing for Activity* – step-by-step explanation to prepare
- *Conducting the Activity* – step-by-step explanation to teach
- *Appraising the Step* – statements describing desired outcomes
- *Climbing Higher* – activities to do beyond each Step
- *The Next Step* – information to help volunteers plan for next Step

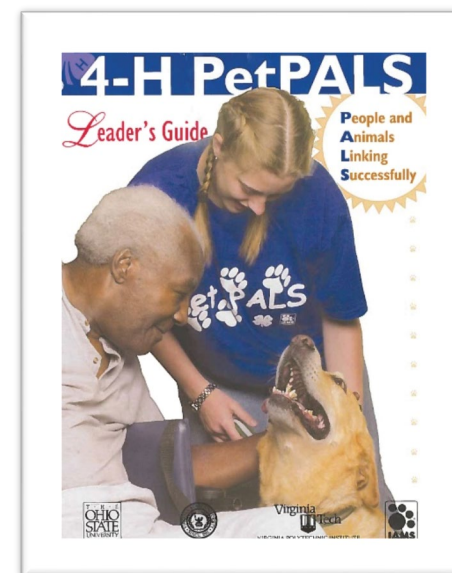

About 4-H PetPALS

- Leader-directed
- Master 4-H PetPALS Volunteer Leaders
- Two-fold curriculum
 - Youth learn skills to interact with people of all ages and abilities
 - Youth learn skills to train and prepare appropriate pets for Animal-Assisted Activities (AAA)
- Human-Animal Interactions
- Animal-Assisted Activities Intergenerational
- Community Service



4-H Volunteers

Master 4-H PetPALS Volunteer Leaders

- Experience with dogs, cats, etc.
- Two-year minimum time commitment
- Attend 6-hour training
- 10-15 hours initially to teach curriculum
- Minimum of one visit per month



4-H Members

- Desire for animal-assisted activities
- Desire to help people
- Own or have access to pet
- Interest in community service
- Commitment to complete training
