- Prevention Education for Youth: Grants will be available to organizations in Kentucky, Ohio, Tennessee and West Virginia. We anticipate funding 30-50 programs at \$25,000-\$35,000 each.
- Best Practices in Pain Medication Use: Grants will be available to organizations in Kentucky, Ohio, Tennessee and West Virginia. We anticipate funding 20-30 programs at \$25,000-\$50,000 each.
- Community-Level Response: These grants will be available only to communities in Ohio. We anticipate funding 5 communities at \$75,000-\$100,000 each.
- The Cardinal Health Foundation has engaged content specialists to provide technical assistance to grantees and to create learning communities. We expect to convene grantees within the next 12 months for further learning.
