

Volunteer Position Description 4-H Youth Development

Position Title:

4-H Shooting Sports County Discipline Instructor – Level 1

<u>Discipline certifications available</u>: Archery, Pistol, Rifle, Shotgun, Muzzleloader, Hunting & Wildlife, Living History, Crossbow, Western Heritage

Time Required:

On-going and dependent on county needs, 3-year commitment preferred. Approximately 3-10 hours per month dependent on number of programs or disciplines offered at the county level.

General Purpose: Be responsible for the overall teaching of knowledge & skills, related to a specific discipline in which the volunteer has been certified at the state level to teach. Working with 4-H members, ages 8 – 18.

Specific Responsibilities:

- Stress Shooting and range safety practices
- Coordinate planning and delivery of county trainings with the county or club Shooting Sports Coordinator.
- Recruit Shooting Sports Volunteers to be instructors and train assistant instructors and Junior Leaders in your discipline, range safety and Shooting Sports policies.
- Recruit Shooting Sports teens to apply to be Junior Leaders and to help with county and state programs.
- Assist with the procurement of county Shooting Sports equipment and resources, by helping with fund raising, grant writing and donation request.
- Ensure that the equipment in use is safe and inspect equipment before every use.
- Use provided National Shooting Sports Curriculum and state lesson plans to teach, having these on site and referring
- Promote Shooting Sports on a county and state level.
- Ensure the adoption of state Shooting Sports policies at the county level including all risk management policies.
- Attend all Shooting Sports club meetings and activities.
- Complete and submit required paperwork, to the club or county Shooting Sports Coordinator by posted deadlines.
- Coach 4-H Shooting Sports members on proper shooting techniques, ensuring safety procedures are followed by all.
- Seek out additional trainings to improve your skills, such as Hunter Safety classes, Red Cross First Aid, 4-H Youth Development trainings, etc.
- Setup a yearly plan for your discipline including meeting dates, lessons and skill to be taught. Share this with your county or club coordinator and provide a copy to the Extension office.
- Obtain a copy of and follow your club or county Risk Management plans.
- Develop an inventory lists for all Shooting Sports equipment in your position and use a check in and out form if equipment is lent to other ADULT Instructors.
- Encourage members to participate in other 4-H activities including Shooting Sports Camps, national, state or county 4-H shooting competitions, county fair judging, camp counseling, etc.
- Answer questions from parents regarding 4-H Shooting Sports or direct them to informational websites, resources or the State Shooting Sports Coordinator.
- Be diligent about your Shooting Sports Instructor recertifications, 4-H reenrollments and other trainings required to maintain your instructor eligibility.

Qualification & Expectations:

- Age 21 or older. All certified Shooting Sports Instructors must be at least 21 years of age.
- Must be an approved 4-H Volunteer.
- State Shooting Sports Instructor certification is required in EACH discipline taught.
- Ability to work with other volunteers, parents and 4-H professionals, to teach and motivate, while nurturing positive selfesteem, decision making, responsibility and leadership skills in the youth members participating in the Shooting Sports program.
- Ability to delegate responsibility.
- Have an interest in the development of youth and the Shooting Sports program.
- Previous experience in the shooting discipline is a plus.
- Knowledge of overall 4-H philosophy, programs and activities or willing to learn about them.
- Ability to work with minimal supervision from 4-H professionals.
- The ability to pass a BCI or other required background checks for working with you and position of a firearm.

Ohio State University Extension Will:

- Provide Instructor Certification training and a National Shooting Sports curriculum handbook upon completion of the training.
- Provide positive youth development training opportunities and resources at the county level.
- Have professional staff available to consult with and listen to the County Shooting Sports Coordinator.
- Provide additional trainings and updates as needed.
